#### Centro Cultural La Corrala – UAM

Street: Carlos Arniches 3-5 Postcode: 28005 Madrid

Underground: Metro <M> La Latina (Line 5)



### How?

- Taxis from/to the airport work on a fixed fare to the city centre: The fare is €33.
- Metro: Madrid Airport is connected to the city via the Metro Line 8 (Pink). From there you need to change at Nuevos Ministerios to the city centre Puerta del Sol (lines 6 or 10).
- Metro fares are around  $\in 2$  but there is a supplement from the airport ( $\in 3$ ).

## Why?

La Corrala is located at the heart of Madrid, between La Latina and the old Jewish quarter (Lavapiés) a multicultural neighbourhood in Madrid. The centre of Madrid (Plaza Mayor, the Royal Palace and Puerta del Sol) is about 10 minutes' walk from it.
